President's Report – October 2012

As reported last month the Seville Festival will be held on Sunday 11 November, 2012 and SPC will participate once again with some activities included for our members. Tracey has advised of the *Freshman's Showjumping* event for SPC members only.

Jumping heights will be per Horse Trials rules and at the following times;

- 45cm from 10:00am to 11:00am
- 60cm from 11:10 am to 12:10pm
- 75cm from 12:20pm to 1:20pm
- 90cm from 1:30 pm to 2:30pm
- 1.05m from 2:40pm to 3:40pm

Cost will be \$2:00 per round payable on the day.

Names go on the list on the day but we would appreciate some notice of who intends to attend so we can plan accordingly. Please let Tracey or myself know.

This will be an SPC only event and we will be requiring riders attending and family members to assist with set up, crash crew, marshalling, gear check and pack up. Don't worry, it is being run as a casual event with riders coming and going during the day so the duties will not be extensive and will be shared around over the course of the day.

In addition we will be raising funds for the club and establishing ourselves further in the local community by hosting parking for visitors to the festival. This will occur in our cross country area – strictly weather and surface permitting.
